

Pact intensifies war against AIDS

Pact Malawi, an organisation that provides and facilitates access to technical and logistic assistance to support the implementation of quality HIV and AIDS care and support programmes, over the weekend donated motor vehicles and motorcycles worth US\$140 million (K19.7 billion) to its partners to ease their transport problems. During the presentation in Lilongwe, Pact Malawi country director Matthew Tiedemann said his organisation donated the vehicles as one way of combating the pandemic. He, however, advised the beneficiaries to take good care of the vehicles. The beneficiaries include, the National Association of People Living with HIV and AIDS in Malawi (Napham), the Malawi Business Coalition Against AIDS (MBCA), the Common Vision for Support Services, Matunkha Centre, Christian Community Church and the Foundation for Common Support Services (Focus).
