


measuring pact's mission **2021** 



In 2021, Pact marked its 50th anniversary. As we reflected on five decades of improving lives around the globe, we noted the many ways that international development has progressed.

While Pact has always worked to ensure our efforts are truly serving communities, one important change has been an increased reliance on data and evidence. Backed by advances in technology and our deep commitment to listening to those we serve, now more than ever, data and evidence are at the heart of Pact's work. This starts with how we design our programs and carries through as we learn and adapt during implementation and as we measure our ultimate results.

Our methods range from qualitative to quantitative, and whenever possible, we advance participatory action research to manage programs adaptively and to ensure skills are passed on and information is of utility to those we serve. For example, in Zambia, to maintain HIV case identification and linkages to treatment, we greatly expanded utilization of a risk assessment tool to help identify those of highest risk. This enabled us to target testing services more effectively. In Cambodia, we used survey research to measure progress in women's economic and civic empowerment. We compared baseline and midline data to adjust program strategies, which were presented in participatory learning reviews with project partners. This has resulted in a quantitative improvement in measures of participant empowerment, the identification of activities that yield the greatest impact, and improvements in reaching targeted populations and in digital civic engagement approaches. And in Colombia, we used a complexity-oriented methodology with indigenous organizations to uncover unexpected outcomes, which

will improve program effectiveness by identifying the most promising approaches to capacity development for key partners.

Our belief in the power of data and evidence to create lasting impact is why for the past 11 years we have measured and shared the results of our global programming in our annual *Measuring Pact's Mission* report. The data that follow explain the impact of our work for the 2021 fiscal year, from October 2020 to September 2021. This includes results from our global indicators in the areas of health, livelihoods, the environment, capacity development, governance, business and markets, and energy. We also share our results by location.

As we look ahead to the coming decades, we know that data and evidence will continue to play a central part in our efforts to build thriving, resilient and engaged communities leading their own development.



Pact works at national and national levels to improve inclusive equitable access to health and social

We achieve this through collaboration with civil society organizations, government agencies, community groups, and private and faith-based service providers. Pact pioneers sustainable community-led HIV/ AIDS and health programming that highlights and meets the needs of vulnerable children. adolescents, pregnant and breastfeeding women, caregivers and families, and key populations. Our integrated community-based solutions have also been instrumental in facilitating community response and resilience to public health shocks and stresses such as the Covid-19 pandemic.


With Pact's support, more than 1.3 million people raised their income and more than 40,000 groups improved their financial situation.




More than **2.7 million people** benefited from improved natural resource management because of Pact, and more than 2.7 million hectares were brought under improved management.

Our governance programming enabled more than 1 million citizens to take part in nearly 2,500 initiatives that resulted in positive civic and state-society engagement.

Open, transparent and accountable governance systems are key to fully inclusive local development. Pact partners with civil society, media and government to expand space for

democratic participation and foster constructive civic behaviors at local and national levels. We support local peace activists to foster healthy social dialogue as the basis for resolving intra- and inter-communal conflicts, including conflicts that cross national borders. We help foster trust among coalitions of local actors - community groups, civil society, governments, private sector - to address difficult collective action challenges. This includes partnering with underrepresented communities such as youth, women, ethnic religious minorities, indigenous peoples and migrant communities to demand accountability and claim essential services and basic rights.

With Pact's support, nearly **175,000 people** increased their access to energy and/or increased their means to use it productively.

Without access to reliable, sustainable and affordable sources of energy, starting or growing a business, delivering modern health care, or enjoying basic comforts such as lighting are out of reach for more than one billion people. #### **BURUNDI**



Pact also assists communities to gain lasting benefits from the more sustainable use of natural resources thereby contributing to the economic and environmentally sustainable growth of Burundi's mining sector.

#### COLOMBIA

In Colombia, Pact works with civil society, institutions and the private sector to reduce child labor and improve working conditions in gold mining as well as the cut flower and unrefined sugar sectors. Pact also supports conservation efforts in the Amazon through partnerships with indigenous peoples' organizations and addresses the Venezuelan migration crisis by focusing on citizen security and social cohesion.

#### **DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO**

In Democratic Republic of the Congo, Pact assists communities to gain lasting benefits from the more sustainable use of natural resources. Pact takes an integrated approach to its work in the mining sector, linking mining to livelihoods, governance, health, environment and the strengthening of local, regional and national institutions.

#### **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC**

In the Dominican Republic, Pact is partnering with communities, governments, private sector, and local organizations and care providers to achieve and maintain HIV epidemic control among pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants, children and youth. Pact provides targeted support to individuals of Haitian descent, including migrants, to address barriers to health care and facilitate access to key complementary services such as education, documentation and food supply.

#### **ESWATINI**

Pact is reducing the impact of HIV in Eswatini with a multifaceted approach, including working with youth, local communities and civil society to ensure they have the tools necessary to combat the diseasese.

#### INDONESIA

#### **LESOTHO**

Pact is working to turn back the tide of HIV in Lesotho through an integrated strategy of health systems strengthening, civil society capacity development, prevention and access to care for vulnerable populations.

#### MADAGASCAR

Pact is also supporting social services for youth empowerment by improving youth employability, professional skills and access to quality education.

#### MALI

Pact works to make artisanal and small-scale mining safer and more productive in Mali by reducing mercury use in gold mining.

#### **MYANMAR**

#### **PERU**

In Peru, Pact increases indigenous people's influence in governance to protect the environment and rights of its indigenous people by building the capacities of indigenous organizations to access and manage financial resources and direct their own development planning and priorities. We also reduce the negative impacts of economic development on forests and water resources.

#### **PHILIPPINES**

We also support the country in achieving sustainable landscape-related climate mitigation goals as submitted to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

#### **RWANDA**

In Rwanda, Pact assists communities to gain lasting benefits from the more sustainable use of natural resources. In doing so, Pact contributes to the economically and environmentally sustainable growth of Rwanda's mining sector. Pact also works to prevent new HIV infections and reduce vulnerability among orphans and vulnerable children and adolescent girls and young women in selected high-burden districts.

Throughout South Africa, Pact works with the government and local partners to develop organizational and technical capacity to strengthen services for orphans and vulnerable children and to deliver quality HIV adherence, treatment, care and prevention.


