







GOVERNANCE II Total number of initiatives resulting in positive state-society engagement, by country.









In Cambodia, Pact worked on improving the health and livelihoods of people by raising awareness of TB and HIV and by helping to promote village banking and microfinance. The organization also works on good governance and corruption issues and on a REDD project with community forestry groups.

Under the Community REACH program, the China program works with PLHIV and their families to develop livelihoods initiatives that will improve quality of life by reducing economic vulnerability. The program aims to develop the human, social and financial capital of PLHIV and their families, and provide a supportive environment that encourages positive health, working in two regions in the southwest of the country with six partners.



# Pact in Democratic Republic of Congo

In the Democratic Republic of Congo in FY2011 there were seven projects that supported 56 partners in livelihoods, natural resource management, capacity development, governance and business and markets. Most of the projects supported communities to be able to utilize their natural resources with equity and transparency. One of the largest projects - the ITRI Tin Supply Chain Initiative (iTSCi) responds to the needs of all the parties throughout the supply chain to certify minerals as conflict free, as well as a mechanism to strengthen and formalize trade of tin, tantalum and tungsten minerals in the Great Lakes region. A similar project works to reduce conflict in the Kolwezi region with artisanal miners. The Salonga project supports the implementation of livelihood activities and land use planning in order to reduce the rate of forest degradation and the loss of biodiversity in the Salonga-Lukenie-Sankuru forest landscape.







# Pact in Ethiopia



The Ethiopia program for Pact operated 13 projects in FY2011 supporting 144 partners to undertake a diverse range of activities, including orphans and vulnerable children programs, alternative and formal education, women and girl's empowerment, and child protection. Alternative education provides access to education for marginalized and pastoral populations in remote areas and capacity development for local government. Formal education work focuses on civic education for 500 primary schools, promoting scouting as a means to activate civil responsibility in surrounding communities. Pact supports sustainable development in Gambella regional state focusing on natural resource management and capacity building with local government entities.





## Pact in Kenya

The Kenya program touches on many impact and approach areas for Pact including governance, livelihoods, capacity development and business and markets. The Peace in East and Central Africa Phase II program -PEACE II - is a five year, USAID funded regional conflict transformation program that started in October 2007 and covers the 'northern arc' border areas of Kenya, Somalia, Ethiopia, Uganda and Sudan. These are categorized as the 'Somali Cluster' to the east, and 'Karamoja Cluster' to the northwest. This program currently focuses in two regions of the country. The KCSSP (Kenyan Civil Society Strengthening Program -KCSSP) works in all 10 regions of the country with 84 partners and focuses on strengthening the capacity of civil society organizations working in advocacy and policy change, peace building and conflict management and natural resources management through capacity development and funding support. to advocate for good governance, peaceful elections and social justice.



#### Pact in Lesotho



Lesotho manages funding for targeted technical assistance to organizations involved in the fight against HIV & AIDS contributing to the Lesotho Partnership Framework. The two main technical areas are Prevention of HIV Transmission and Care and Support for Orphans and Vulnerable Children. The overall goal is to "Reduce the impact of HIV and AIDS and improve health care for Lesotho." The program works in nine of the country's 10 regions and supports 24 partners.





# Pact in Madagascar

Pact in Madagascar is a Global Fund Principal recipient and is responsible for programs to reduce the rate of TB in the population and to reduce the rate of malaria. The TB program aims to reduce the rate of TB in the population by maintaining a detection rate above 70% and by increasing the rate of treatment success from 76% to 85% by 2014. The malaria program will focus on the entire population, targeting pregnant women and children under five. The main target of the program is to ensure universal access to effective malaria prevention, diagnosis and treatment in order to reduce the impact of malaria on the population in a move towards malaria elimination. The Madagascar program also supports a child protection program that aims to remove children from the worst forms of child labor.








#### Pact in Malawi



In Malawi, the Community REACH program supported 15 partners to provide supportive HIV services to their communities in the areas of prevention, PMTCT, care and treatment and supportive services for OVC and their children. Pact also partnered with JHU to support the capacity development of networks in 11 of JHU's district who provide support for developmental activities including HIV and AIDS targeting in many local communities.



# Pact in Myanmar

The Myanmar program supported 10,516 organizations in the country in six projects in FY2011. The largest project in Myanmar is the microfinance project that supports more than 9000 women-led savings and microfinance groups in several regions of the country. The SAHEEA program promotes the sustainable access to health for needy communities in Myanmar by increasing community capacity to plan health and related activities and by enhancing their income for health and economic needs. Pact also has programming in Myanmar to reduce mortality related to HIV and TB, for women's health and livelihoods, and for community response to health.






#### Pact in Namibia



Pact in Namibia supported six community based organizations in FY2011 focusing on building their capacity toward being able to accept direct funding from USAID. Pact also supported the Ministry of Gender Equality and Child Welfare to build its planning, managerial, and monitoring and evaluation capacity while assisting the MGECW to plan and implement key policies.






# Pact in Nigeria

Pact in Nigeria supported four projects in FY2011 with 64 local partners. The LEAD project supports 13 partners in a peace and democratic governance project that builds partnerships between state and local governments, civil society and the private sector. The ADVANCE project supports four key partners to enhance civil society capacity to engage effectively and constructively with government. Pact also supports a major HIV & AIDS and Orphans and Vulnerable Children project in Nigeria through a Community REACH award that currently partners with 36 community based organizations to provide effective service. Pact also supported 9 partners to conduct organizational capacity assessments (OCAs) to assess capacity prior to the initiation of a five year MNCH program.






### Pact in South Africa






#### Pact in South Sudan

The Pact South Sudan office supported 11 projects in FY2011 that worked with 123 local partners. The majority of Pact's programming in South Sudan focuses on supporting local and national capacities for non-violent resolution to conflict and supporting broader processes for recovery and stability. Pact's programs also enable communities to be in charge of their own social and economic development.

#### Pact in Swaziland



In Swaziland, Pact is implementing a five-year program through 2015 that provides grants to local and international organizations implementing HIV & AIDS interventions (Sexual Prevention, Gender, Care and Support, Counseling and Testing, and OVC) for PEPFAR in Swaziland. The overall goal is to "reduce the impact of HIV & AIDS and improve health care for Swazis". The program works in all four regions of the country and supports 15 partners. Pact also collaborates with ICAP (Columbia University) to build the capacity of regional health management teams in several regions.






#### Pact in Tanzania

In Tanzania in FY2011, Pact implemented 6 projects supporting governance, health and livelihoods initiatives. The STAR or Strengthening Transparency, Accountability and Responsibility project worked in 10 of the 30 regions in the country and supported 19 partners to empower citizens at the community level to demand transparency and accountability from their government. Two OVC projects were operating in 2011 working in five regions of the country and supporting 37 partners to provide quality OVC services. Pact also carries out livelihoods programming in two projects that support 31 partners to focus on increasing and diversifying income of targeted women through skills training and economic development. Pact also supports three partners to implement a child protection program aimed at children in need to justice, care and protection.



#### Pact in Thailand



In Thailand, through the Community REACH program, Pact supported 24 partners and 22 community groups in Thailand, Laos and the region to build the capacity of local partners working with key affected populations. These include people living with HIV and targeted sub-populations at risk for HIV infection. Pact also partners with PSI in the Greater Mekong to provide capacity building support to nine community-based organizations in four countries. Pact pioneered livelihoods programming for people living with HIV that built confidence, increased incomes, created community, and reduce stigma. In 2011, Pact began a three year Global Fund project to develop Thailand's M&E system to improve programming for children affected by AIDS.



#### Pact in Ukraine & Belarus

Pact implemented three projects in Belarus in FY2011 that worked with four international implementers and directly with 53 local partners. The overall goal of the Pact implemented projects in Belarus is to promote well-informed citizen participation in community-based civic initiatives. Our strategy is to support the creation of political and civic space in Belarus and assist organizations and activists to make effective use of this space by strengthening their capacities. The projects' main areas of activity are: 1) civil society development, 2) strengthened media support and information dissemination, 3) legal protection, and 4) engagement with independent trade unions.





#### Pact in Vietnam



Pact's program in Vietnam contributes to enhancements in the scale, quality and effectiveness of the civil society response to HIV & AIDS, through support of comprehensive prevention, care, support and treatment interventions, and through the creation of a supportive social and policy environment. The program worked in 17 of the 63 regions of the country and supported 20 local partners.

#### Pact in Zimbabwe

Pact's project in Zimbabwe supports a national peace-building framework as well as democratization and good governance. The project also strengthens the rule of law through constitutional reform and promotion of human rights, rule of law, governance and media freedoms. In FY2011 Pact supported 72 partners in six different projects and worked widely throughout the country with some projects working in all 10 provinces.
