









PROGRESS IN NUMBERS

USAID's "Community Action for HIV Control" project tracks and analyzes **how NGOs** are **making progress towards ending the HIV epidemic, such as:** how many people were tested, how many HIV positive cases were diagnosed, how many newly diagnosed HIV-positive individuals were enrolled in anti-retroviral treatment (ART), and how many people at high risk for HIV were enrolled in pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) or received other services.



COMMUNITY ACTION FOR HIV CONTROL

QUARTER LEADERS

Our partner NGOs: PO Synergy Of Souls, CO Network 100 Percent of Life. Zaporizhzhia and CO 100 Percent Of Life. Kyiv Region were the most effective in testing people for HIV this quarter. As of March 26, we collected the following data on the effectiveness of testing:

Index testing remains one of the most effective ways to detect new HIV cases. Insights of this quarter:

- CO 100 Percent of Life. Kyiv region detected 40% of all positive cases of the organization for the quarter thanks to index testing.
- CO 100% Life Dniprov
 Region was able to involve
 all index partners whose
 contacts it received in
 testing, and 54% of them
 tested positive.
- CO Charitable Society All-Ukrainian Network Of People Living With HIV/AIDS —Lviv City received the highest rate of consent to provide contacts: 95% of PLHIV provided contacts of their partners






ASSESS COMPETENCIES

We continue to assess the competencies of project coordinators in partner NGOs in such areas as strategic thinking, operational capacity, result orientation, etc. This assessment helps identify strengths and priority areas for the development of each coordinator.

I liked the way the preparatory process for the assessment was organized: extremely informative, comprehensive, and positive. When the competencies were assessed, the mentor was not an outside observer or supervisor, but a member of our friendly team.

DEVELOPING MONITORING OF VIRTUAL SERVICES

We held a working meeting on monitoring the accessibility and quality of HIV services in our project, where we discussed:

- the results of using the «secret client» tool to evaluate the provision of services on the TestVdoma platform
 and the continuing of this tool to evaluate HIV and HBV testing services, as well as additional services in
 partner NGOs,
- additional services KP representatives can receive from partner NGOs (screening for NCDs and GBV, distribution of humanitarian aid, etc.)
- community requests regarding problematic aspects of access to diagnosis and treatment of viral hepatitis and standards of service delivery of substitution maintenance therapy programs with the Public Health Center of the Ministry of Health of Ukraine.

Such events help to analyze the experience of implementing new tools and continue to improve the work of NGOs in the field of HIV services.



ANALYTICS ON HIV TESTING IN HEALTH INSURANCE PACKAGES

We have prepared an analytical note on HIV testing services in the packages of the Medical Guarantee Program. In this brief, you will find information on which healthcare packages include HIV testing, where and how to get HIV testing services, what are the grounds for providing services upon self-referral, and what documents regulate the specifics of medical data transfer.



INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

For three months, we have been running a national awareness campaign where we encourage representatives of key populations to get tested for HIV at our partner NGOs. In addition, partner organizations have launched regional campaigns in their cities. Online and offline activities, carefully planned for each target group, have already brought at least 695 new clients to our NGOs for HIV testing. The campaings utilized:

SUCCESS STORY. A LIGHT OF HOPE

Unconditional support and the absence of stigma and discrimination are the basis of the work of our partner organizations that provide HIV testing services. When a client comes to an NGO, he or she must feel safe.


A woman came to our office asking to be tested for HIV. She told us that she had been sick for a long time, and treatment did not help. She also admitted that she was taking noninjecting drugs, — says Svitlana, a social worker at the CO Light of Hope.

At the consultation, Natalia (name changed) was stressed, and was cautious about making contact. The woman had learned about the organization through social media and came for testing from another region because she was too afraid that someone in her city would find out about it. The test result was positive.

I suspected that I was HIV-positive, but it was very embarrassing to find out my status for sure. I had all kinds of thoughts about how to live my life and what to do now, — Natalia recalls.

On the same day, Natalia talked to a social worker, went to an infectious disease doctor, and was registered with the clinic. She received the necessary antiretroviral treatment, which has already improved her health. Natalia started a new stage of her life without fear, or judgment and with the support of the organization's team.

OPPORTUNITIES

HEALTH AMBASSADORS

As part of the project, the Health Ambassadors program has been launched in remote communities in Zhytomyr and Chernihiv oblasts. In April it will be launched in the Kyiv region.

Health ambassadors help community members raise awareness of healthy lifestyles and thus promote the idea of health care, and help build healthy lifestyle skills. In addition, health ambassadors inform residents about MMT's visits to communities, as well as the launch of mobile pharmacies, patient transportation services, and psychological support spaces.

There are already 23 health ambassadors working in the communities.

NEW LAUNCHES

We are actively working on launching these activities in the communities.



mobile pharmacy units: specially equipped vehicles of the SE Ukrvaktsyna will bring medicines to remote communities, in particular under the Affordable Medicines program;



psychological support spaces: safe rooms where community residents can receive qualified psychological assistance online for free;



a patient transportation service to bring people with serious chronic diseases, people with limited mobility, and those who have been referred by doctors from mobile medical teams to medical facilities.



MOBILE MEDICAL TEAMS (MMT)

In the village of Noryntsi in the Narodytska community, as many as 24 out of 25 people who came for a checkup were referred to narrow specialists during one of the visits. Most people were found to have chronic diseases of the cardiovascular or endocrine system. There is also high demand for psychological counseling, as people face a lot of pain, depression and anxiety as a result of the war.

Mental health problems remain widespread in the communities of Chernihiv Oblast: MMT's psychologists recorded various degrees of depression in patients. In addition to psychological consultations, community residents had the opportunity to visit a gynecologist, cardiologist, and neurologist, in addition to their family doctor. Specialists of the mobile medical team encountered a case of domestic violence and were able to provide the necessary assistance.

Specialists in the mobile medical team continue to provide assistance to residents of the Baryshivska and Tetievska communities. Cases of heart disease and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease have been recorded, and there are also requests for psychological assistance. In the Baryshivska community, a case of type 2 diabetes was detected promptly: based on the results of the blood glucose assessment, the client was prescribed preventive treatment and referred to an endocrinologist.
